

We have 28 million energy inefficient homes in the UK. 80% of the buildings we will have in 2050 have already been built.

The UK has the oldest housing stock in Europe, In England, about 20% of homes nearly 5 million - were built before 1910. While only a small proportion of these are listed buildings (at least 320,000, of which 125,000 date partly or even wholly from before \$700).

Lacenham has over 200 listed buildings.

92% of respondents agreed we should be concerned about flooding in the village


